HAVING grown up by the sea, it is no surprise that one-time Geraldton woman Lynda Howitt has been well and truly seduced by it.

Her passion and love for the ocean has culminated in Lynda holding a joint exhibition with American-born Sydney photographer Christian Mushenko at the Bathers Pavilion, Balmoral in Sydney.

The exhibition was born out of the artists' connection with the sea, and a need to explore its beauty. The romance of the sea is evident in these works, through a dream-like light, a graceful velvet feel and sensual colours.

Lynda Howitt was born in Uganda, the only white baby in a mission hospital a long way from the sea. Her family fled Idi Amin's massacres to the shores of Western Australia, where they settled on the ocean front in Geraldton. From the age of three Lynda spent all her spare time in or on the water.
